Irresistible Grace

What happens when an irresistible force pulls on an immovable object? We find out which of them is guilty of false advertising.

Irresistible Grace is a term that means everyone God says will be saved will be saved. No one can resist His call. This is another term for that dreaded word—predestination.

People don't like this, because they envision it as denying them free will. Like God is going to drag us into heaven as we kick and scream, "I don't want to be saved!" The best verse I've found in the Bible to illustrate how this really works is in Acts 13:48. *"...and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed."* There is not a conflict between God's call and man's faith, but an agreement. No one is being forced to believe; no one is being forced not to.

At the same time, all the credit for our salvation goes to God, not to us. *"For those whom He foreknew He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, in order that He might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those whom He predestined He also called, and those whom He called He also justified, and those whom He justified He also glorified."* We are the recipients of God's choosing and His acting. Our only action is to receive the gift; everything else is dependent on Him.

We all have different stories, and yours won't look like mine. My story, however, provides a good illustration of Irresistible Grace.

My gorgeous fiancée and some friends



of hers invited me to a Bible study. I did not want to go. There was nothing about it that appealed to me. I was not interested in Christianity, the Bible, or the people who would be there. I mostly preferred the kind of people who don't go to Bible studies. I mostly liked doing things people who go to Bible studies don't do.

But, after continual pestering and a promise to leave me alone in the future, I agreed to go. That evening I encountered Irresistible Grace. I found out my 'immovable objections' to faith could be swept away as easily as a cobweb. They were made of about the same quality of stuff.

Other people, with very different stories, describe themselves as 'Seekers.' But the Bible tells us, *"No one understands; no one seeks for God"* (Rom 3:11). There are two ways I see to reconcile seekers with Scripture. The first is that God initiated the seeking. He called them, and in response they sought Him. The other is that rather than seeking God, they are seeking alternatives to God. Many people sense a religious hole in their hearts, but don't like what they see when they look at the God of the Bible. Either kind of seeker, though, if God has called him, will find God.

How do we respond, then, to the irresistible call of God's grace? How about doing what Paul said in Ephesians 1:18-19, *"Having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which He has called you, what are the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of His power towards us who believe."* Praise God.

We formed a subcommittee to draft out exact placement for plumbing & drainage, so we can move forward to pouring footings, stub walls, and a foundation. There is still some discussion about bathroom size going on.

One big discussion everyone enjoyed is the idea of putting two 8 foot roll-up doors on the north side, for ease of moving pot lucks and activities outside in nice weather. The biggest difficulty we see ahead is providing for adequate drainage, especially between the current Sunday School wing and the new building.

We are currently in the process of lining up contractors for the major work we cannot do ourselves.
